**DO NOT
ENTER IF SICK**



Cough or sneeze into your elbow and do not touch your face

Birthstone of the Month - Turquoise

December's birthstone has long been prized for its beauty. For centuries, people have incorporated turquoise into jewelry, art, masks, and architecture. Though found all over the world, the stone gets its name from its prevalence in ancient Turkish culture. In North America, the Aztecs mined turquoise in the area now known as New Mexico, and a significant amount of modern turquoise comes from Arizona, Nevada, and California. The stone is most commonly pale blue with veins of brown or black.



Flower of the Month - Holly



December's flower is the hearty holly plant. Its bright red berries and glossy, deep green leaves have come to symbolize the winter holiday season, particularly Christmas. Holly also symbolizes truth and protection. It grows in temperate and subtropical climates. Holly berries, which can be red, brown, black, green, or yellow, are slightly toxic to humans but can be eaten by birds. Some types of holly leaves are used to make tea.
